



Dominique RIQUET – MEP, Chairman of the Long-Term Investment Intergroup

Elected at the European Parliament in 2014 for a second mandate, Dominique Riquet is the first Vice-Chair of the transport and tourism committee and a member of the industry, research and energy committee.

As a member of the UDI (Union des Démocrates et Indépendants) in France, he joined the ALDE (Alliance of Liberals and Democrats for Europe) within the European Parliament. Particularly involved in infrastructure financing, he was rapporteur on the Connecting Europe Facility and he is currently rapporteur for opinion on the European Fund for Strategic Investments ("Juncker Plan"). In the meantime, he has become the founder and chairman of the intergroup on long-term investment and reindustrialisation (#Invest4Future). Prior to that, he was Regional Councillor for the Nord Pas-de-Calais region (1992-2009) and he also served for ten years as the mayor of Valenciennes (2002-2012) following Jean-Louis Borloo. Born in 1946, Dominique Riquet holds a degree in general medicine and a degree in urological surgery.



Phillipe CITROËN – Director General of the Association of the European Rail Industry (UNIFE)

Philippe Citroën joined UNIFE in June 2011. He began his career as Transport Advisor at the French Permanent Representation to the EU in 1986 and then became Member of the Cabinet of the French Transport Minister in 1990. In 1993 he became Manager and Chief of Staff at RATP Paris, and joined the SNCF as Strategy Director in 1999. Prior to assuming his position at UNIFE, he served for 8 years as CEO of Systra, one of the world's leading public transport engineering companies.

Mr Citroën is a graduate of Paris II University in Public Law, holds a Diploma from the Paris Institute of Political Studies (Sciences Po) and also studied at the Ecole Nationale d'Administration (ENA), where he also lectured about Rail and Urban Transport. He is married and has three children.



Anna Lisa BONI – Secretary General of EUROCIITIES

Anna Lisa Boni is Secretary General of EUROCIITIES since 2014. Previously, she was the director of the Brussels office of the French region Provence Alpes Côte d’Azur. Anna Lisa Boni has 20 years of professional experience in EU public affairs in the field of local and regional government. She has worked for the city of Bologna in Italy, and has extensive experience with international and European networks and the European Parliament.

A committed European through education, upbringing and career, she has worked for a stronger recognition of cities' challenges within the European agenda. Based in Brussels since 2001, Anna Lisa Boni is of Italian nationality and speaks four European languages.



Andrey NOVAKOV – MEP, Member of the Long-Term Investment Intergroup

Mr Andrey Novakov is the youngest Member of the European Parliament. He joined the institution in November 2014. A member of the EPP, he is a Vice-Coordinator in the Committee on Regional Development (REGI) and a member of the “Knowledge 4 Innovation” Governing Board. He is also covering the Committee on Budgets (BUDG) and Budgetary Control (CONT).

In the REGI Committee, Mr Andrey Novakov and his team are mainly focused on the future of EU funding, EU financing for businesses, entrepreneurs, innovators and infrastructure. The latest priorities are securing stable levels of financing under Horizon 2020 and the post-2020 R&I funding.

The future Multiannual Financial Framework and the annual EU budgets are among the core activities of Andrey Novakov in the BUDG Committee. For two consecutive years, he was part of the negotiating team for the 2018 EU budget.

In the CONT Committee, Mr Novakov and his team have been involved in the evaluation of the 7th Framework Programme.



Aleksandra OLEJNIK – Coordinator of the activities of the City of Łódź (Poland) in international organizations

Mrs Olejnik is a postgraduate student at the Faculty of Management at the University of Lodz, where she performs her research work on innovation activities in urban centers.

Currently, she is a coordinator and advisor of the City of Lodz in relation to international organizations and political affairs to the European Committee of the Regions and the Council of Europe. She is responsible for the creation and implementation of innovative projects in cooperation with private entities and academic centers. Plenipotentiary of the President of the City of Łódź for the EU Urban Agenda.



Mark – R. SONTAG, Executive Director – Mobility Finance, Siemens Financial Services

Pierre AUBOUIN – Head of the Infrastructure & Transportation Department, Division of Investments & Local Development, Caisse des Dépôts et Consignations

Mr. Aubouin serves as the Head of the Infrastructure & Transportation Department at Caisse des Dépôts' Investments & Local Development division since 2015. Previously he was Chief Financial Executive Officer and Member of Executive Board at Areva SA since 2011.

He began his career with KPMG in 1992 as an Auditor and served as a Manager from 1997 to 2000 and was responsible for a large portfolio of French and foreign industrial customers, particularly in the high-tech sector.

From 2000 to 2006, he served as a Consultant, Project Manager and Associate Principal for McKinsey & Company in corporate finance and strategy, high tech and media practices. In 2006, he joined Agence des participations de l'Etat (APE, the French government shareholding agency) as Head of the Aeronautics & Division unit then as Division Director for Services, Aeronautics and Defense shareholdings.

From, 2008 to 2011, he was a Director of Safran USA, Inc. and then was a Member of the Supervisory Board at Safran SA and its Director since April 21, 2011. He served as a Member of the Board of Directors at Sogepa and Sogead Gerance (EADS holdings), DCNS, Imprimerie Nationale and SNPE.

Mr. Aubouin is a graduate of the ESSEC Business School and holds a diploma in further accounting and finance studies (DESCF).
